Our two year study of the Attributes of God series will conclude by the end of the summer to be followed by a verse by verse study of the book of Nehemiah, based on the book "Nehemiah, Memoirs of An Ordinary Man" by Stephen Davey.

The Coble/Shearon Sunday School Class seeks to lift up the Bible as relevant truth that can direct and encourage our daily lives. The Gospel Project Discipleship Guide provides the opportunity for 5 daily devotional readings in the week prior to class discussion. Sunday classes are taught by Jenny Coble or Jonathan Shearon using multimedia. Because we can all learn from and encourage one another, class discussion is encouraged and valued. The co-ed class is currently made up of "empty-nesters" and soon to be empty-nesters with high school aged children as well as single adults. All are welcome to join us.
